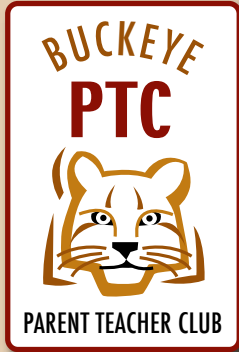

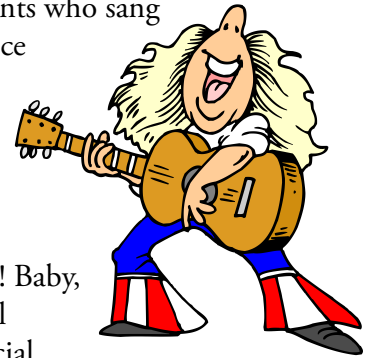

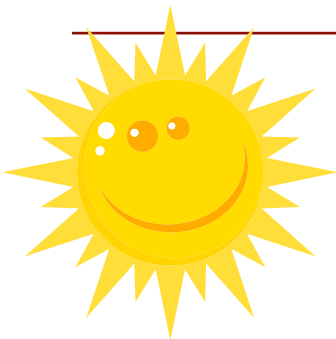
## Volunteer Spotlight Shines on Beth Barry
